1. The Ministry of Health would like to inform the public on the current situation of the COVID-19 infection in Brunei Darussalam for Thursday, 30 Jamadilawal 1442 / 14 January 2021, as of 12 noon.

In connection with the news of a positive case reported in a neighboring country on 13 January 2021 and which is said to be imported from Brunei Darussalam, the Ministry of Health would like to inform the public that preliminary investigations have found no immediate contact has been identified. However, the Ministry of Health has expanded surveillance activities to ensure that no latent infections occur among the community. To date, a total of 37 people comprising friends including colleagues who have met with the case within 14 days before the case left Brunei Darussalam have been instructed to undergo the SAR-CoV-2 test for the purpose of this survey. They have also been instructed to undergo self-isolation until test results are obtained.
