



MEDIA STATEMENT OF THE CURRENT SITUATION OF THE COVID-19 INFECTION IN BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

22 Syawal 1441 / 14 June 2020

- 1. The Ministry of Health would like to inform the public that today, Sunday, 22 Syawal 1441 / 14 June 2020, Alhamdulillah with the grace of Allah Subhanahu Wa Ta'Ala, there is no new case of COVID-19 infection in the country. Therefore, the total number of COVID-19 cases in Brunei Darussalam remains at 141 cases, whereas the total number of cases that have recovered is 138 individuals.
- 2. At this time, there is only **one case** still being treated at the National Isolation Centre, where the case is still in critical condition and require heart / lung machine (ECMO) as well as respiratory assistance. Let us together pray for the patient to be granted full recovery by Allah Subhanahu Wa Ta'ala. Aamiin Aamiin Ya Rabbal Alamin.
- 3. At this time, **67 individuals** are currently undergoing quarantine in accordance to the Infectious Diseases Act (Chapter 204) and a total

of **2,756** individuals have completed their quarantine and are in good condition. However, there are 279 individuals who are currently undergoing mandatory self-isolation at monitoring centres provided by the Government that is those who have recently arrived in the country after traveling abroad. To date, a total of **2,401** individuals have completed their mandatory self-isolation at these facilities.

- 4. In the past 24 hours, a total of **434 samples** have been tested for the SARS-CoV-2 virus that brings the total number of laboratory tests conducted since January 2020 to **24,833 tests**.
- 5. Following the announcement on the *Bruhealth App*, Alhamdulillah at this time a total of **378,346** individuals have registered to the application. In addition to that, a total of **8,021** companies and premises have registered for the BruHealth application. Meanwhile, a total of **4,117** business premises have downloaded the **PremiseScan application**. In relation to the PremiseScan application, all premises are advised to download the application to facilitate the QR code scanning especially for those who do not have access to mobile phone devices to enter premises.
