



MEDIA STATEMENT OF THE CURRENT SITUATION OF THE COVID-19 INFECTION IN BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

05 Zulkaedah 1441 / 27 June 2020

- 1. The Ministry of Health would like to inform the public that today, Saturday, 05 Zulkaedah 1441 / 27 June 2020, Alhamdulillah with the grace of Allah Subhanahu Wa Ta'Ala, there is no new case of COVID-19 infection in the country. Therefore, the total number of COVID-19 cases in Brunei Darussalam remains at 141 cases.
- 2. Meanwhile, currently there are **406 individuals** who are undergoing mandatory isolation at the monitoring centers provided by the Government, who have just arrived in the country after traveling abroad. At present, a total of **2,691** individuals have completed their mandatory self-isolation at the monitoring centres.
- 3. In the past 24 hours, a total of **312 samples** have been tested for the SARS-CoV-2 virus that brings the total number of laboratory tests conducted since January 2020 to **28,707 tests**.

- 4. Following the announcement on the **Bruhealth App**, Alhamdulillah at this time a total of **402,582 individuals** have registered to the application. For companies and premises, a total of **10,788** have registered for the BruHealth application. Meanwhile, regarding the premiseScan application, a total of **5,863** have downloaded the PremiseScan application by **4,236 business premises**.
- 5. In relation to the serology survey conducted at several selected mosques as announced in the press conference dated 15 June. The preliminary findings of the survey showed that 12 participants from 504 participants had tested positive for the serology survey. However, all the participants who were found to be positive in the survey as well as their family members have been found to be negative on the swab tests for SARS-CoV-2 and confirmed to be free from active infection. The public are advised not to worry when receiving news about anyone who has been found to be positive in the serology survey.
