



MEDIA STATEMENT OF THE CURRENT SITUATION OF THE COVID-19 INFECTION IN BRUNEI DARUSSALAM

06 Syawal 1441 / 29 May 2020

- 1. The Ministry of Health would like to inform the public that today, Friday, 06 Syawal 1441 / 29 May 2020, Alhamdulillah with the grace of Allah Subhanahu Wa Ta'Ala, there is no new case of COVID-19 infection in the country. Therefore, the total number of COVID-19 cases in Brunei Darussalam remains at 141 cases, whereas the total number of cases that have recovered is 138 individuals.
- 2. At this time, there is only **one case** still being treated at the National Isolation Centre, where the case is still in critical condition and require heart / lung machine (ECMO) as well as respiratory assistance.
- 3. In the past 24 hours, a total of **255 samples** have been tested for the SARS-CoV2 virus, that brings the total number of laboratory tests conducted since January 2020 to **18,962 tests**.

- 4. Furthermore, following the announcement on the *Bruhealth App*, Alhamdulillah at this time a total of **242,827 individuals** have registered as users to the application. In addition to that, a total of **4,100 businesses and premises** have registered for the application. In this regard, members of the public who have not registered are encouraged to download and register to the Bruhealth App. Public's cooperation in the use of the Bruhealth app and the scanning of the QR Code at the entry and exit point in premises will help ensure the safety of the public including merchants and customers, as well as to facilitate the Ministry of Health to conduct contact tracing in case there is an outbreak of the infection. Let us keep reminding each other on this matter.
- 5. In addition to that, the public is also reminded to continue to practice preventive measures and to be vigilant where ever they are by practicing physical distancing, ensuring hand hygiene as well as practicing the correct cough and sneeze etiquette. Furthermore, in celebrating this year's Eid, the public is also reminded to abide by the Eid Aidilfitri Guideline that was released by the Ministry of Health such as to only celebrate Eid only with immediate family members and to abide by the mass gathering guideline that is to limit to 20 -30 individuals at any one time according to the size of the home.
