1. The Ministry of Health would like to inform the public on the current situation of the COVID-19 infection in Brunei Darussalam for Monday, 23 Rabiulawal 1442 / 09 November 2020, as of 12 noon.

2. The Ministry of Health would like to inform that on Sunday, 8 November 2020, a department store company in Jalan Muara was fined a compound of \$5,000 for failing to comply with the Mass gathering guidelines. The company has been found to hold a promotional sales event and encouraged large gatherings of more than 350 people without implementing any appropriate regulatory measures.

3. The Ministry of Health would like to advise the public to comply with all regulations and directives issued. Any individual found to be in violation of or disobey any order issued shall be an offense under the Infectious Diseases Act (Section 204), which if found guilty can be issued compound fine up to \$5,000 or can be prosecuted in court carrying a fine up to \$10,000 or imprisonment up to 6 months or both.

4. Furthermore, the Ministry of Health would like to remind the public to practice their social responsibilities by maintaining personal hygiene, practice proper cough and sneeze etiquette, recommended to wear a face mask in crowded public places and if feeling unwell, not to go to public places and attend social gatherings. The public including business premises are required to comply with all regulations and directives related to the reduction of social distancing measures that have been issued and are still in force at the moment.
