2. The Ministry of Health would like to remind the public, especially for individuals who are seeking approval to travel abroad and to any countries that require for them to conduct a swab test for SARS-CoV-2 before arriving to the country, that at present the swab test can only be conducted at Government facilities or at facilities that are approved by the Government. As soon as the results for the test is released, the Ministry of Health will issue a letter confirming the test results to be shown to the authorities in the destination country. Individuals who need to do a swab test for certain reasons are advised to go to the Sports Complex, Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Saleha Hospital or at specific health centres that provide such services. Meanwhile,

any premises that offers swab test services without permission or recognition from the Ministry of Health is deemed to be in violation of the law which may result in a compound fine of up to \$5000 or if convicted in court, can be fined up to \$10,000 or imprisonment for up to 6 months or both. The Ministry will not hesitate to take legal action against anyone who does not comply with the directives that have been issued.
